Rules and Guidelines

- The competition is limited to **only Syro-Malabar faithful**. Participants may, among others, include members from parishes, communities, institutions, congregations, seminaries and/or individual families of the Syro-Malabar Church.
- Although there are no restrictions on the number of entries per group; only one will be considered for the purpose of evaluation.
- Songs should be strictly from **East Syriac Tradition** only.
- Recomposition is not allowed; the songs should be sung only in the traditional East Syriac tune. Four-part harmony singing is allowed.
- This is a group event. A team should have a minimum of five members. There is no restriction on the age of participants.
- Any instrument in line with the spirit of liturgical music may be used. Karaoke is allowed.
- Teams will be evaluated, among others, especially on singing voice quality and finesse in Syriac pronunciation. Videos recorded on mobile phone cameras are allowed.
- Each entry should be of length not less than three minutes. Each entry may include more than one song.
- Entries are to be sent to roohamedia@gmail.com or [www.fb.com/RoohaMedia](https://www.facebook.com/RoohaMedia) on or before **15 June 2018**. Late entries will not be considered.
- Entries will be uploaded on our Facebook page **16 June 2018** onwards in the order in which they were received.
- While evaluating, 50% weightage will be given to the likes and views received for the uploaded video till **15 July 2018, 11:59 PM**

- Judges decision will be final.

To live life as a Nasrani, as a true son of Mar Thoma Sleeha and uphold the traditions of the Church, stand for its identity, recite Liturgy of the hours and to not swim with the tide very specially in the context of a migrant community like Delhi, is no mean task and requires effort and pain.
