Syriac is one of the oldest languages in the world. It is a dialect of Aramaic, the language of Jesus Christ in the 1st century Palestine. Syriac found its entrance to Kerala through the Apostle St. Thomas. The Syrian colonization of Malabar from Edessa under the leadership of Bishop Joseph and Thomas of Cana raised the status of Syriac as the liturgical language. Syriac infact continues to be the official liturgical language of the Syrian Christian Churches of Kerala. Syriac literature is the sole representative of the genuine Semitic Christianity.
